






Biking on the rise

Other Cycling Improvements

Bike corrals:

- 14 bikes in the space of 1 car
- 10 corrals across city
- Year-round availability at select locations in 2013-14

Hubway:

- 8 initial stations, 4 more last year
- Interest in future year-round operation, following Cambridge example

SBC proposals for 2014

New campaign of paint-based bicycle facilities

Bicycle-truck safety equipment pilot

Bicycle parking requirements

Programming / education



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- Goal → Attain at least 10% of residents commuting by bike (2x today)
- Strategy → Make it safer and more comfortable for residents of <u>all</u> ages to bicycle
- Objective → Expand and connect our fragmented bicycle route network

SBC recommends a campaign of low cost, paint-based, near-term bike facility additions:

- Webster Avenue
- Prospect Street
- Park Street
- Central Street
- Summer Street
 - Bow Street
- Medford Street
- School Street

Each conceptual design is based on surveyed dimensions and can be implemented.







Summer Street: Cutter Ave to Willow Ave Eastbound bike lane Bike box at Willow Ave






Summer Street: Willow Ave to Spring St Eastbound bike lane Westbound sharrows






Summer Street: Spring St to Prescott St Westbound bike lane Eastbound sharrows



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Problem: Large trucks are disproportionately deadly to pedestrians and cyclists


- 4% of vehicles in U.S.
 - 11% of cyclist fatalities, 7% of ped fatalities
- 4% of London vehicles
 - **53%** of cyclist fatalities

Why?

- 1. Blind spots
- 2. Side underride → cyclists/pedestrians fall under rear wheels in collisions

Side underride guards ("sideguards")

Devices installed on large trucks to help prevent bike/pedestrian fatalities in overtaking, right-hook, and left-hook crashes

Blocks cyclists/pedestrians from sliding under the rear wheels in a collision

Precedent:

- European Union, United Kingdom, Japan, China, Israel, Latin America...
- DC, NYC, Portland (OR), California.
- 2013: **Boston and Cambridge** piloting sideguards on 22 DPW vehicles, adding sideguard requirement to RFPs for city contracts. Partnering with USDOT.











Portland, OR

Safety benefits:

61% decrease in cyclist fatalities in UK in side-impact crashes with large trucks after national sideguard law

20% decrease in same types of pedestrian fatalities

Costs:

Multiple ways to cover the danger zone:

- Off-the-shelf sideguards (\$600+ per vehicle)
- Custom-made sideguards (\$2,500 per vehicle, Boston)
- Toolboxes and fuel tanks (cost varies, Portland)



What could a Somerville pilot look like?

- DPW refuse and dump trucks
- Construction contracts, residential waste collection contracts
- Assess O&M impacts, perceived/actual public safety of different sideguard types

Regional coordination opportunity

Boston, Cambridge, Somerville, Newton? USDOT evaluation input?





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Zoning - Bicycle Parking Requirement

The SBC is reviewing and developing a series of recommendations for improvements to Section 9.15 (Bicycle Parking) of the Somerville Zoning Ordinance













Zoning - Bicycle Parking Requirement

Goals:

- Clarification of dimensional and layout standards
- Clarification of standards for location of bicycle parking
- Create standards for access to bicycle parking area from a public way
- Reconsider number of spaces required match requirement with demand.













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2014 objectives

We want your ideas.

- How can we encourage safe cycling around schools and with youth?
- How can we engage the schools (students, faculty, parents) so that they are more involved in the bike improvements the city makes?

2014 objectives

- Hold joint events with Cambridge, Arlington, Medford, Charlestown to promote bike planning awareness and coordination
- Beacon St cycletracks: provide additional input for final design, monitor impact of construction on bike travel and make detour recommendations
- Continue public engagement by hosting bike-week related events, tabling at farmers markets and participating in SomerStreets
 - Organize a kids bike race or a cargo bike race at SomerStreets
- Participate in the Union Square Transportation Study, Davis Square Study, Central Broadway Initiative, Sullivan Square Disposition, and other transformative opportunities

Also, check in on 2012 and 2013 goals:

- Complete streets
- DPW abandoned bike tagging protocol
- "Except Bicycles" signage on select streets that are always two-way for abutters but are posted one-way for motorists only during certain hours












Somerville vs. Peer Cities

Residential

- High number of units needed to trigger requirement
 - Somerville: 7
 - Most peers: 3 or fewer
- No distinction between short-term/visitor and long-term/resident
- Required number of spaces lower than in Cambridge or Boston

Commercial/Industrial

- Requirement in terms of number of car spaces
 - Does not account for differences in bike vs. car needs
- Required number of spaces lower than in Cambridge or Boston



"Except Bicycle" for temporal Do Not Enter

Temporal "Do Not Enter Except Abutters" signs are intended to prevent cut-through car traffic in one direction on two-way streets during specific times.

Bicycles are not cut-through traffic and do not cause jams. Yet temporal Do Not Enter signs force significant detours for bike commuters.

Proposal: add "Except Bicycles" plaques to "Except Abutters" at all locations.
